

Every year at the National Shrine of Our Lady of Good Help the novena to the Sacred Heart of Jesus and the Immaculate Heart of Mary is devotedly prayed and celebrated. This "Two Hearts" devotion powerfully expresses our love and reliance on the help and strength that comes from the Love of Jesus and Mary. This form of piety within the Church today is not just needed, it is essential.

Devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus and the Immaculate Heart of Mary is crucial for the restoration of life and culture surrounding humanity today. From time immemorial these two hearts have symbolized the intense love that our Blessed Lord and our Lady have for all.

One can never be lead astray with a strong and intense devotion to the Sacred and Immaculate Hearts of Jesus and Mary. Indeed, many promises come with such devotion. Our Lord promised Saint Margaret Mary Alacoque that those who remain devoted to His Sacred Heart will (among many other promises): "have all the graces necessary for their state of life; I will give peace in their families; Persons who propagate this devotion shall have their names eternally written in my Heart; In the

excess of the mercy of my Heart, I promise you that my all-powerful love will grant to all those who will receive Communion on the First Fridays, for nine consecutive months, the grace of final repentance: they will not die in my displeasure, nor without receiving the sacraments; and my Heart will be their secure refuge in that last hour." These promises are of course assured to those who practice devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus fervently and consistently.

Saint John Eudes wrote: "What union. what intimacy, what understanding and correspondence between these two Hearts... The Holy Heart of Mary was, therefore, always intimately united with the Sacred Heart of Her Divine Son...She always desired what He desired and also consented to act and to suffer so as to fulfill the work of our redemption." Many saints and holy men and women have shown the wealth of spiritual gifts that accompany those who know and appreciate the love that emanates from the hearts of Jesus and Mary.

The "Two Hearts" devotion, particularly the nine first Fridays and five first Saturdays, contain a treasure trove of graces. The connection

between the Two Hearts is not hard grasp. God willed that Mary, in relation to her Son, should cooperate with Him in the regeneration of human kind. Please join us in our Novena of Masses and prayer in preparation for the celebration of the feasts of the Sacred Heart of Jesus and the Immaculate Heart of Mary from June 1st through the 9th.

What is a Eucharistic Healing Service?

One of the many questions we get asked here at the Shrine is: "when is the next healing Mass?" The trouble is the Shrine does not offer a healing Mass but rather a Eucharistic healing service that follows the celebration of Holy Mass. The Shrine of Our Lady of Good Help started these services after many powerful and moving Eucharistic Healing services were celebrated by Fr. Ubald Rugirangoga, a visiting Rwandan priest with a healing ministry (who has since reposed in the Lord). It became clear that Mary was moving the Shrine to begin its own ministry of healing through the Eucharistic presence of Christ. Now, on the last Saturday of every month, the Shrine offers these same healing services for anyone who would like to attend.

After Mass, starting at around 12 noon, we expose the Blessed Sacrament and pray to Our Blessed Mother for her intercession on our behalf as we ask for healing in our lives. Confessions are heard for anyone who would like to go during or after the service. A brief reflection is usually given to help orient our minds and hearts to be disposed to receive the healing Love of

Christ. The Blessed Sacrament is then processed around the Church, blessing and making his presence felt by those in the pews. The celebrant then returns the Blessed Sacrament to the altar and offers a prayer of thanksgiving. The service is then concluded with solemn Benediction.

It is of course encouraged for all who attend to at some point make a good confession; as we know the true power of Christ's presence in our lives is the power to forgive us our sins and welcome us back into the company of God.

"When Jesus saw their faith he said to the paralytic, "Take heart, my son; your sins are forgiven." And behold, some of the scribes said to themselves, "This man is blaspheming." But Jesus, knowing[a] their thoughts, said, "Why do you think evil in your hearts? For which is easier, to say, 'Your sins are forgiven,' or to say, 'Rise and walk'? But that you may know that the Son of man has authority on earth to forgive sins"—he then said to the paralytic—"Rise, take up your bed and go home." And he rose and went home. When the crowds saw



it, they were afraid, and they glorified God, who had given such authority to men." – Matthew 9: 2-8

Physical healing pales in comparison to the gift of His forgiveness of our sins. It is clear that our Blessed Mother wants the love of Her Son to be known by as many souls as will listen to this message with faith. The Eucharistic healing services held by the Shrine of Our Lady of Good Help are for the purpose of facilitating this encounter with Christ and His Church such that one's faith is strengthened and repentance is sought. May we all come to know the loving Mercy of Christ our God.

Summer is fast approaching, With it comes the height of pilgrimage season at Champion and the joy of hosting pilgrims of all ages returning to The National Shrine of Our Lady of Good Help to pray and worship, individually, with their families, school groups, religious orders, or religious groups.

To accommodate the increased needs of those scheduling pilgrimages and those wishing to volunteer at the Shrine, we have added a part-time pilgrimage and volunteer coordinator, Debbie Mercier. Debbie will be a familiar face to many who have visited the Shrine, as she has been a part-time gift shop associate for the past two years. Her experience in the gift shop and contact with volunteers will serve her well in her new role as the pilgrimage-volunteer program development.

Our volunteers help in many ways as greeters, café helpers, gift shop sales associates, adorers, and general maintenance. Be it for one day or multiple days a week, we are always in need of volunteers at the Shrine. If you are available, please feel free to contact Debbie. Our department is now busy planning to accommodate those who are visiting us on various religious group pilgrimages. We are also preparing to host

many conferences and retreats at the Shrine.

Thus far this year, we have already held three major conferences, Respect for Life conference in January, the Esto Vir Men's Conference in March, and the Divine Mercy Retreat and Conference in April. May brings the opening of Marian Month at Champion, with the Walk to Mary and May Crowning Celebration and the Veneration of the Relics of the Apostles at the end of the month. In June, we will host Patrick Reilly of the Cardinal Newman Society on Father's Day and we are planning for a major Memorial Mass in honor of the late Father Ubald and will be hosting the Green Bay Youth Conference.

July brings the return of the Biking for Babies Apostolate and the kick off here at the Shrine July 11 of the Northern Route. August will bring the Tri Association of the Order of Malta back to Champion for their annual Family Conference and Retreat and Assumption Mass weekend will be held with a special guest speaker, August 14-15. In September, on the weekend of the 11th and 12th, we host our Annual Nativity of Mary Blessing of the Grapes and first Harvest Festival. October opens with our nine-day Novena

to Our Lady of Good Help during which we host various events, retreats and speakers including the Flame of Love conference.

Most of these events will be held in our new Mother of Mercy Hall which offers opportunities for us to hold a variety of retreats and conference and educational seminars. This year we will also host several groups on private retreats, among them: confirmation students, church staff and clergy, and others who want to come to the Shrine for a day or two to reflect on their roles in their organization, learn some valuable information from their speakers and seek Mary's intercession to become more Holy in carrying out their responsibilities.

Gradually, we are seeing a return to the Shrine of more groups and have already had increased requests for dates for pilgrimage, so plan now. 
