## **Champion Shrine Holds Day of Prayer for Protection of Unborn**

Shrine to offer 12-hour Eucharistic Adoration on January 22 in observance of the Day of Prayer for Legal Protection of Unborn Children

(Champion, Wis.) – Since the 1973 U.S. Supreme Court decisions of Roe v. Wade and Doe v. Bolton, over 60 million abortions have occurred in the United States according to the <u>USCCB</u>. In hopes for the full restoration of legal guarantee of the right to life and penance for violations to the dignity of the human person, the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) has designated January 22 as a particular day of prayer and penance, known as the Day of Prayer for Legal Protection of Unborn Children. In observance of this day, <u>The National Shrine of Our</u> Lady of Good Help will be offering Eucharistic Adoration from 7 a.m.-7 p.m. on Saturday, January 22.

"With great trust in our Lord's providence and our Lady of Good Help's intercession, we believe our prayers are heard and met with great aid," said Rev. John Broussard, C.P.M. and Rector of the National Shrine of Our Lady of Good Help. "Our hope at the Shrine is to offer a place of refuge that recognizes the sacredness of life for all, and we ask those willing to join us in prayer that day – either on the grounds of the Shrine or remotely."

In addition to Eucharistic Adoration from 7 a.m.-7 p.m., the Shrine will be holding its regularlyscheduled daily activities, including Mass at 8:30 a.m. and 11 a.m., Reconciliation following the 8:30 a.m. Mass, Rosary at 10:30 a.m., and Chaplet of Divine Mercy at 3 p.m. All activities will be held in the chapel on the Shrine grounds.
