



REGISTRATION, PAYMENT, REFUND:

Registration is done online at championshrine.org/youth-day. Single attendees must be accompanied by parent/guardian - if one is not able to accompany, please inform kciha@championshrine.org and a Virtus chaperone will be provided for attendee. \$20/person (students and chaperones). An Early Bird Pricing will be available from March until the end of May for \$15/person. Priests attend Truly Alive Youth Day at no charge. Registration includes materials and lunch. Registration will close at 11:59pm August 2, and parishes will be invoiced based on the number of students/chaperones registered at that time. Any changes to registrations must be made prior to closing and must be done via e-mail. Registration fees are not refundable, unless the Diocese cancels the event.

CHAPERONES:

Chaperones must have completed the eApps online background check, complete VIRTUS training and sign the Code of Pastoral Conduct for Volunteers (see parish LoSec prior to trip). Chaperones must be 21 years old or older. Ideally, there should be one chaperone per 8 students, and minimally one male chaperone for male minors and one female chaperone for female minors.

EMERGENCY, MEDICAL INFORMATION, WAIVERS

Parish group leaders must ensure student emergency information necessary medication, and any pertinent medical information is in their possession. gbresources.org/formspolicies and should be kept on-site by parish group leader. They will not be collected by the Diocese.

TRANSPORTATION:

When private passenger vehicles is used, the following criteria apply:

- Driver must be a minimum of 21 years of age.
- Driver must possess a valid, non-probationary driver's license.
- Driver must complete the eApps online background check, complete VIRTUS training, sign the Diocesan Code of Pastoral Conduct for Volunteers.
- The vehicle must have a valid registration and have insurance coverage consistent with Diocesan requirements.
- Unless you are the parent/guardian of the minor, driving alone with a minor is not tolerated at any time.

HEALTH CONDITIONS:

Parents are responsible for making certain their child is healthy and able to attend events such as the youth day. Please do not bring students or chaperones who have symptoms of illness. If there are subsequent waves or variants of COVID-19 that are resistant to vaccines or other approved therapies, we will follow all federal, state, [Brown] county and local mandates related to safety and to the mitigation of the COVID-19 pandemic.

DRESS CODE:

Dress Code In keeping with Diocesan policy, students and chaperones should be dressed appropriate to their gender, keeping in mind the surroundings (Shrine, Mass) and the season (August in Wisconsin).
