Dear Friends in Christ,

Praised be Jesus Christ!

This past May during our Marian Conference, we were blessed to have Fr. Donald Calloway be one of our speakers. He wrote a book entitled: "Consecration to St. Joseph: The Wonders of Our Spiritual Father." Also, this past May, we had our annual Walk to Mary, which formally starts at the National Shrine of St. Joseph in De Pere, WI. Thus, even though we are a Shrine dedicated to Our Lady, I don't think our Blessed Mother would mind us mentioning her most chaste spouse. I think it is fitting that we dedicate some time to the foster father of Jesus since he is also a Patron of the Universal Church. I am always encouraged when I hear this famous quote from St. Teresa of Avila about St. Joseph:

Blessed Virgin Mary, Mother of Hope

What is hope?

The Catechism of the Catholic Church in section 1817 states this: Hope is the theological virtue by which we desire the kingdom of heaven and eternal life as our happiness, placing our trust in Christ's promises and relying not on our own strength, but on the help of the grace of the Holy Spirit. "Let us hold fast the confession of our hope without wavering, for he who promised is faithful." (Hebrews 10:23)

How do you live in hope?

Hopeful people trust in God's Providence. Knowing that we are His adopted children gives us a sense of peace and hope; He will never put us in a situation we can't handle without His grace. Hope-filled people rarely give in

to discouragement knowing that "All things work for the good of those who love God." (Romans 8:28)

How do you primarily receive hope?

Hope is a theological virtue that is primarily received through prayer. After the sacraments, prayers such as the Rosary and the Chaplet of Divine Mercy can increase our hope. In addition, making a formal Act of Hope is recommended every day. Here is a popular Act of Hope:

O my God, relying on Your almighty power and infinite mercy and promises, I hope to obtain pardon of my sins, the help of Your grace, and life everlasting through the merits of Jesus Christ, my Lord and Redeemer. Amen.

US Bishops Decide Whether to Affirm Opening the Cause for Adele Brise

During the June 2024 Plenary Meeting for the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB), Bishop David L. Ricken of the Diocese of Green Bay will hold a consultation with his fellow Bishops on opening the cause for beatification and canonization of Adele Brise, Marian Visionary of Our Lady of Champion.

Within this consultation, he will present on the life of Adele, her virtues, and the story of Our Lady's apparitions to her in 1859. The Bishops will then hold a vote on whether to affirm Bishop Ricken in opening the cause for Adele. By the time you are reading this, a vote will have taken place, and we ask for your prayers - that God's will is done.





While this meeting with the US Bishops to affirm opening the Cause for Adele Brise does not mean the cause is officially opened, it does mean that steps are being considered and taken to one day open her cause for beatification and canonization, God willing. As Bishop Ricken stated in a recent OSV News article, "There is no set timeline; it's on God's time."

All we can do is pray that heaven and the Church will reveal God's will for Adele's cause. Join me in praying this prayer for Adele:



Eternal Father, your servant, Adele Brise, offered her life as a sacrifice of love. With great devotion to the Mother of God, she sought to instruct the ignorant and pray for the conversion of sinners. She was a servant of your grace and an advocate for spreading the True faith. Teach us to imitate her love for you and her heroic devotion to your service.

If it is your will that she should be venerated among the Saints of your Church, make known by miracles and favors the glory she enjoys in your presence. Trusting in your merciful goodness, and in the power of the Holy Spirit, graciously grant me the grace of (Your Intention). I ask these things in the Name of Jesus the Lord.

Spiritual Opportunities at Champion

It's been an abundant spring for pilgrimages at the National Shrine of Our Lady of Champion!

Walk to Mary registered 5,895 walkers, with an additional 2,000 visitors at the Shrine on Saturday, May 4th. We celebrated four Masses that day with 3,650 in attendance. Our third-annual, sold-out Marian Conference brought in over 430 people seeking a closer relationship with our Blessed Mother. The conference speakers included Father Don Calloway-MIC, Father Bill Casey-CPM, and Mother Mary Catherine of the Missionaries of the Word, who all did a wonderful job of illuminating the theme "Mary – Virgin Most Powerful."

As we look toward the Summer and Fall at the Shrine, there are many opportunities for you as a pilgrim to visit the National Shrine of Our Lady of Champion:

On August 15th, the Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary always brings many pilgrims to the Shrine to celebrate Mass and participate in the Holy Rosary procession. Many generations of pilgrims enjoy attending Mass and reliving their past experiences at the Shrine, whether as a child or young adult visiting with their parents. It is also an opportunity for those new to the Shrine to experience these traditions as well. This

year, we are honored to welcome Cardinal James Michael Harvey, Archpriest of the Papal Basilica of St. Paul Outside-the-Walls in Rome, as he celebrates the 11 am Holy Mass for the Solemnity of the Assumption at the Shrine alongside Bishop David Ricken.

Jumping to the fall season, the National Shrine's Novena to Our Lady of Champion starts on October 1st and ends with the 165th anniversary of the last apparition of the Blessed Virgin Mary to Adele Brise on October 9th. The Solemnity Mass of Our Lady of Champion on the Shrine's grounds will be celebrated by Bishop David L. Ricken at 11:00 am. If interested in bringing a bus of pilgrims, be sure to connect with the pilgrimage office to arrange your visit!

Leading up to this day, The Feast of Our Lady of the Rosary (Oct. 7th) and the Miracle of the Great 1871 Fire (Oct. 8th) will also be commemorated at the Shrine.


Monday, Oct. 7th, is the Feast Day of Our Lady of the Rosary, instituted by Pope Pius V after the miraculous victory of the Battle of Lepanto on Oct.7, 1571. We will honor this Feast by celebrating Mass at 11:00 am. This is followed by a Rosary procession around the grounds and a special enrollment in the Confraternity of the Most Holy Rosary for visiting pilgrims.

On Tuesday, October 8th, we will commemorate the anniversary of the Miracle of the Great 1871 Fire. During the day, visitors can explore the rich heritage of the Belgian people who settled in the Northeast Wisconsin area. Partnering alongside the Belgian Heritage Center, exhibits will be displayed with pictures, news articles, and presentations depicting the lives of the Belgian people in the area. Traditional, homemade Booyah (a chicken-based vegetable soup), Belgian Pies, and other Belgian delights will be available for lunch for a small fee. In the evening, the account of the Miracle of the Fire is proclaimed in the Apparition Chapel, with all-night Adoration and rosary processions on the hour around the grounds. Votive candles will line the paths around the grounds that evening, representing prayer intentions of the faithful.



Looking Back

May 4, 2024 | Walk To Mary

The 11th annual Walk to Mary was a beautiful day with just under 6,000 walkers coming to Champion from the various route join-in points. An additional 2,000 people came to the grounds of the Shrine to experience the energy and joy of the event and to witness the walking pilgrims who traveled from across the world to be there. 43 States were represented as well as a few countries. Thousands of prayer requests

Adele Brise, the visionary who saw our Blessed Mother in present-day Champion, passed away peacefully on the Shrine's grounds in 1896. In honor of her death, Champion Shrine will hold a moment of prayer at her grave-site after its 11 a.m. Mass.

August 15, 2024

Feast of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary

One of Champion Shrine's longeststanding traditions! Pilgrims from all over the country come to celebrate the Assumption of Our Blessed Mother on the grounds where she appeared in 1859. Join the Shrine as it continues its historic Mass and rosary procession led by a statue of the Blessed Virgin Mary. Mass will be celebrated by Bishop David Ricken and Cardinal James Michael Harvey, Archpriest of the Papal Basilica of St. Paul Outside-the-Walls in Rome and past prefect of the papal household for St. Pope John Paul II. Confessions, Enrollment in the Brown Scapular and a family picnic lunch are included in the day's events. Spend time in prayer with your loved ones, encountering the presence of Our Lady of Champion.



October 7 – 8, 2024

Feast of Our Lady of the Rosary and Anniversary of the Great Fire

GIFT SHOP AND CAFÉ

Eucharistic Congress Art Collaboration

What began as a concept in the summer of 2023 with the National Eucharistic Congress, has turned into a shining movement to celebrate sacred art and Our Lady for the National Eucharistic Revival!

The team at the National Eucharistic Congress reached out to The National Shrine of Our Lady of Champion, sharing their desire to have artwork from churches, Shrines, and sacred sites at the National Congress in July. The Shrine was then paired with a well-known artist from St. Louis, Gwyneth Thompson-Briggs, to paint the beautiful scene of Our Lady of Champion's appearances to Adele Brise in 1859.

Gwyneth describes the painting through her lens:

This painting highlights the Eucharistic element of Our Lady of Champion by uniting the three apparitions to Adele Brise into a single image. As in each apparition, the Queen of Heaven is depicted robed in dazzling white, standing between two trees—a maple and a hemlock—in the midst of an ancient forest in early October 1859. She appears to dissolve into a cloud of mist, as she did after the second apparition. As Adele noticed in the third apparition, a yellow sash surrounds Our Lady's waist, a crown of stars surrounds her head, and her long, wavy golden hair falls over her shoulders. Adele could hardly look at her face because of the bright light shining around her. In the painting, a sheer veil communicates this not-quiteblinding light. The right half of Adele's face, clearly lit to the viewer, reveals what must have most distinguished her in the eyes of the world: the prominent



scars from a childhood accident with lye. The left half of her face, with her eye fixed on the Queen of Heaven, is veiled in shadow from the viewer. Adele is dressed in workday clothes, as she was at the time of the first apparition, when she was on her way to the gristmill with a sack of wheat. The wheat also alludes to the second and third apparitions, when Adele was on her way to and from the reception of Holy Communion. As during the third apparition, she has fallen to her knees to receive her mission from the Queen of Heaven:

Gather the children in this wild country and teach them what they should know for salvation . . . their catechism, how to sign themselves with the Sign of the Cross, and how to approach the sacraments.

Our Lady's raised right hand at once suggests the mission to go out and gather the children of the country, and the blessing she seemed to impart before disappearing. Adele's acceptance of this mission is symbolized by her embrace of the wheat, which becomes the interpretive key of the painting. Cultivated in the midst of the wilderness by the children of the country, the wheat is called - like them - to be transformed through the Cross and the Sacraments; and with Adele's cooperation—into a pure sacrifice to the Lord.

The final work of art will be on display in a chapel at the National Eucharistic Congress in Indianapolis from July 17-21, it will then travel to the National Shrine of Our Lady of Champion

to be displayed for pilgrims to see and pray with.

Champion Shrine's gift shop will have several items featuring this art, including prayer cards and various-sized prints.

They will be available beginning this summer, 2024.

We are very grateful that
Champion Shrine was invited
to participate with the Eucharistic
Congress in this program and
look forward to sharing the
wonderful piece of artwork with
our visitors to the Shrine!
