Spiritual Reflection

The Month of May, a Month dedicated to Mary

We are blessed as Catholics to dedicate a whole month to the Mother of God. Besides celebrating her Visitation during the last day of the Month, it is fitting that we do something extra to honor our Blessed Mother. Certainly, making a pilgrimage to the National Shrine of Our Lady of Champion is highly recommended, but besides that, in our homes and at work or school, we can incorporate devotion to Mary.


Here are my top five recommendations to honor Jesus through Mary during this month of May:

- 1. Pray the Rosary (daily recommendation)
- 2. Pray the Angelus or Regina Caeli (during the Easter Season) three times a day
- 3. Consecrate yourself to the Blessed Virgin Mary (especially as a perfect renewal of your Baptismal promises)

- Incorporate the Five First Saturday Devotion in your interior life (Communion, Confession, Rosary, and keeping Mary company while meditating on the mysteries of the Rosary for 15 minutes)
- 5. Join one or both of her very popular Confraternities: The Confraternity of the Most Holy Rosary and the Confraternity of the Scapular of the Blessed Virgin Mary of Mt. Carmel.

Finally, I recommend reading Fr. James Socias' book, "Handbook of Prayers." There is a section of his book that has a recommended daily offering to Mary during the month of May. Some of my favorite recommendations in his book include a visit or a conversation with a loved one whom we want to encourage to go to Confession, completing five small hidden sacrifices in honor of the five wounds of our Lord, and the effort of doing our ordinary work well, on time, with competence and finesse.

COMMUNICATIONS CORNER

"Is the Cause for Canonization open yet for Adele Brise?"

This is a question that we hear quite often at the Shrine from visiting pilgrims. The answer to the question is "No, not yet." However, this process is being discerned, and there are several things that need to be done before a Cause can be opened. One of those things is the drafting of the Libellus, which means "little book." It is the document that is presented to the Bishop as a petition to open the Cause. This Libellus includes a short biography, writings or dictations, and a witness or testimonies to the life of the person of interest. If opened, this Cause for Adele would be considered an Ancient Cause because of the amount of time that has elapsed since her death. This makes the collection of witnesses and testimonies a bit more challenging, as there is no one alive who had direct contact with Adele.

In this situation, witnesses for the Cause would likely fall into one or more of the following categories:

• Descendants of Adele's siblings or descendants of those who knew Adele, whose stories of Adele and her mission would have been passed down through each generation.

• Those who have received particular graces through the intercession of Adele, or those who have heard of family members, friends, or others who have received particular graces through the intercession of Adele.

• Those who have extensively researched the life of Adele and the history of the Shrine itself.



A Call for Witnesses

If you or someone you know falls into one of these categories, we would ask that you pray about sharing your witness or testimony of Adele. This is a critical component needed to open the cause! For those who discern to come forward, we ask that you simply send a letter via email or regular mail with your name, contact information and a brief summary of your witness or testimony to Adele's holiness and life of heroic virtue.

As we assemble the list of witnesses (we will need about twelve), we may reach out to you if we need to clarify your information. If the Cause for Adele were to be opened, you would also be interviewed by the Postulator for the Cause, who is responsible for the overall process.

We ask for Adele's intercession in bringing forth witnesses of her life – that her story may reach more souls and that her witness to Christ may bring consolation to those in need.

The Year of The Eucharistic Revival

One of the greatest celebrations this year is the National Eucharistic Congress, to be held in Indianapolis, IN, from July 17th to July 21st, 2024. It will gather tens of thousands of Christians to experience profound personal revival in their Catholic faith, especially through Jesus in the Eucharist. Leading up to the Congress, four pilgrimage routes across the country have been established for people to participate in and engage with the Eucharistic Revival movement. Named the "National Eucharistic Pilgrimage," the routes move from city to city with Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament, and the public is encouraged to join in the journey as Christ makes His way to Indianapolis!

The Northern Route, also known as the "Marian Route," starts at the headwaters of the Mississippi in northern Minnesota, makes its way through Minnesota, Wisconsin, and Illinois, and joins the other three pilgrimage routes at the Congress in Indianapolis. Along its journey, the Marian Route will make a special stop at the National Shrine of Our Lady of Champion — the first and only approved Marian Apparition Site in the United States – on Sunday, June 16!

Champion Shrine is honored that the National Eucharistic Pilgrimage selected

Our Lady of Champion to be the official patron of the northern Marian Route. As Adele journeyed to and from Mass on October 9, 1859, the Blessed Mother appeared to her and asked that she offer her Communion for the conversion of sinners. As the National Eucharistic Pilgrimages traces Adele's steps at the Shrine, it will recall Our Lady's words and her accompaniment with us as we journey with Jesus through life.

The National Eucharistic Perpetual Pilgrims will journey with the Blessed Sacrament from the National Shrine of St. Joseph in De Pere, WI, to the National Shrine of Our Lady of Champion, arriving around 1:00 pm CT. The schedule for the afternoon at Champion Shrine will look like the following:

- 2:00 Holy Mass
- 3:15 Following Mass, a Eucharistic Procession will take place on the 1.7-mile walk around Champion Shrine
- 4:00 Light social of cookies, desserts, and beverages to celebrate the pilgrimage
- 5:00 Following the procession, Adoration of the Eucharist will be available.
- 7:00 Benediction



Honoring a Sacred Space - the Apparition Chapel Renovation

Amidst the flickering candles and the hushed whispers of prayers, the Apparition Chapel is the center of liturgical life at the Shrine. For many pilgrims, the Chapel is a cherished refuge where they can come in from a cold world and experience the warmth and love of our Blessed Mother and her Son. Thousands of pilgrims pass through the Chapel doors each year. To ensure the Chapel remains ready to welcome the next generation of pilgrims, the Shrine began an eight-week Chapel renovation project in early January 2024. From the outset of this project, the guiding principle of the renovation was to maintain the chapel's historical integrity and simplicity. Every detail was meticulously planned and executed to ensure that the essence of the Chapel remained intact while also enhancing its functionality, accessibility and beauty.

As the cold Wisconsin January ushered in the new year, a local flooring company spent six weeks removing the old vinyl flooring and installing new ceramic tile throughout the Chapel entrance, bathroom, nave, sanctuary, and sacristy. With the new flooring installed, the next phase of the renovation project began. The old sound system was replaced with a new one, which includes new speakers throughout the sanctuary and nave and a hearing loop. A hearing loop is a system that sends sound directly to a hearing device while also helping to eliminate background noise. Now, everyone should be able to hear the Fathers of Mercy homilies better! At the same time, a local woodworking company installed the custom-created front altar, ambo, credence table, and communion rail, which took over five months to craft. These new pieces are made of wood, similar to the back altar, and provide harmony between the major pieces in the sanctuary. By the end of the eight weeks, the Chapel and the Apparition Oratory received a thorough cleaning from top to bottom to ensure they were ready to welcome pilgrims again.

On an unseasonably warm March 2nd,

Bishop David Ricken welcomed a full chapel of pilgrims for Mass. The first Mass back in the Chapel included the Rite of Dedication of the new Altar, transforming the new altar from a wood table into a sacred altar of worship. After the homily, Bishop Ricken prayed the Litany of Supplication, followed by the Disposition of the Relics, St. Digni, and St. Justiniani. Bishop Ricken placed both relics within a special drawer in the altar during the dedication because, from the very beginnings of the Church, the Mass was prayed on the tombs of the saints. From these ancient traditions, the Church has continued to honor this practice by placing relics of saints in altars. Bishop Ricken said the Prayer of Dedication, followed by the Anointing with sacred chrism and Incensation of the Altar. Once that was complete, four volunteers cleaned the altar and placed two altar cloths. The altar servers then placed and lit the altar candles, signifying the altar was now ready for the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass.

The journey of this renovation project began with a vision to honor the sacred place that holds profound significance for many pilgrims. During this journey, we were also reminded of the power
